ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Associate of Science in Management to the Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Administration

Associate of Science in Management to the Bachelor of Science in Project Management

This Articulation Agreement is built on the foundation of a professional and collaborative relationship between Bunker Hill Community College and Northeastern University. The provisions in this agreement will serve as a standard procedure when a student applies to transfer with the following Associate of Arts or Science degrees from Bunker Hill Community College to the aligned Bachelor of Science degrees listed below at Northeastern University.

Bunker Hill Community College (**BHCC**) and Northeastern University (**Northeastern**) College of Professional Studies have developed this articulation agreement for the following programs:

- Associate of Arts in Business to the Bachelor of Science in Management (Article A)
- Associate of Science in Accounting to the Bachelor of Science in Finance and Accounting Management (Article B)
- Associate of Science in Data Analytics to the Bachelor of Science in Analytics (Article C)
- Associate of Science in Finance to the Bachelor of Science in Finance and Accounting Management (Article D)
- Associate of Science in Management to the Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Administration (Article E)
- Associate of Science in Management to the Bachelor of Science in Management (Article F)
- Associate of Science in Management to the Bachelor of Science in Project Management (Article
 G)

I. PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT

- A. <u>Program Objectives:</u> This agreement has been established to facilitate the transfer of students in select Associate of Arts and Associate of Science programs within the division of Professional Studies at BHCC to have a smooth transition into select Bachelor of Science programs at Northeastern.
- B. <u>Program Summary</u>: This is an academic articulation agreement that creates an admissions pathway from the designated associate degree programs at BHCC into the aligned BS completion programs at Northeastern.

II. TERMS OF AGREEMENT

- A. Students who graduate with the Associate of Arts or Science (as outlined in Articles A-G) at BHCC with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher will be eligible for admission into the aligned Bachelor of Science programs at Northeastern under the terms of this agreement.
- B. Students must meet all Northeastern admission requirements, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges.
- C. A minimum of 120 credits is required for graduation from Northeastern bachelor degree programs.
- D. Northeastern will allow the transfer of up to 66 credits into the Bachelor of Science programs.
- E. Students must achieve a grade of C or better in order for a course to transfer to the Bachelor of Science programs at Northeastern.
- F. This agreement may be publicized to the campus community, catalog, website, publications and newsletters by both schools.
- G. Both institutions agree to maintain current listings of course equivalences listed in Articles A-G. This will be the responsibility of the two designated representatives.
- H. The colleges agree to notify each other promptly, in writing, of substantive changes in curricula that might affect this agreement.
- I. Every three years, upon review of this agreement, Northeastern shall provide BHCC with data on BHCC transfer students in the programs identified in Articles A through G above to determine the success rates for BHCC students who transfer to Northeastern under this agreement.

Data to be shared with BHCC:

- Number of BHCC students who transferred to Northeastern pursuing programs identified in this agreement
- Date of enrollment at Northeastern
- Date of degree completion
- Cumulative grade point average

This data shall not contain any personal identifying information and will be used solely for the purposes described. With the exception of the Data Recipient of BHCC, the Coordinator of

Enrollment, the data shall not be shared or made available to any unauthorized personnel or other third party unless otherwise specified in this agreement.

- J. Communication regarding the agreement may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff at both institutions will communicate information about this agreement to students, including referencing this agreement in their catalogs, websites, and other appropriate marketing materials.
- K. Northeastern and BHCC agree to review this agreement for possible revision and renewal every three years or when changes to curriculum occur. If this agreement is not renewed, students who have been selected and designated to this program prior to termination of the agreement will be given two additional years, beyond the then-current three-year interval, to be admitted to Northeastern under the terms of this agreement.

III. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE AGREEMENT:

BHCC and Northeastern agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their respective students and prospective students concerning the established relationship between the two institutions, including the following:

- A. <u>Oversight of the Agreement</u>: The initial designated representatives for the agreement will be the Dean of Professional Studies from Bunker Hill Community College and the Senior Vice Provost of Curriculum and Programs from Northeastern University.
- B. Program Eligibility: BHCC students who successfully complete the articulated associate degree program at BHCC (Articles A-G), in accordance with its published standards and subject to and in accordance with the limitations and procedures set forth in this Agreement, will be eligible for admission into Northeastern Bachelor degree programs. All reference to standards will be those published in the respective current catalog of each institution and other applicable materials published by each institution. Northeastern retains full discretion to make the final decision on each student's application, and admission is not guaranteed.
- C. Advising and Enrollment: Transfer Services and the Professional Studies Department of BHCC and Northeastern agree that they will communicate at the beginning of each fall term to discuss recruiting, entrance requirements, and any other concerns that either may have about the affiliation. Other communications between them may be scheduled as needs arise. Each party agrees that it will communicate as soon as possible to the other party of any changes to its programs that will impact this Agreement. Each institution shall provide the other with advance copies of, and an opportunity to correct or revise, any written materials that it publishes to describe the terms of this Agreement.

D. <u>Transfer of Courses:</u> The transfer of BHCC courses is articulated in Articles A-G, along with the remaining Northeastern courses to be completed to earn the BS degree.

IV. Published Materials

- A. All published materials including, without limitation, any and all reports, outlines, manuals, pamphlets, brochures and other documents prepared by BHCC shall remain the property BHCC, and all such materials prepared by Northeastern shall remain the property of Northeastern. All brochures and marketing materials for this Program shall be developed and mutually agreed upon by both BHCC and Northeastern.
- B. BHCC and Northeastern shall have unrestricted authority to publish, disclose, distribute or otherwise use, in whole or in part, any and all materials prepared under this Agreement. Neither Institution shall use the name, logo, likeness, trademark, image or other intellectual property of the other for advertising, marketing, endorsement or any other purpose without the specific prior written consent of an authorized representative of the other Institution with respect to each such use.

V. Joint Responsibilities of Northeastern and BHCC

The parties shall jointly undertake the design and implementation of the following affiliation activities during the period of this Agreement:

- A. The parties shall explore academic networking opportunities for faculty, staff and student advisors to promote thorough understanding of the educational programs offered by the two institutions and the respective campus cultures.
- B. The parties may develop faculty workshops focused on establishing common understandings of the nature of the institutions' complementary missions and visions for the future, the enrichment lent by each to the other through proximity of programs and services, and the educational roles of the institutions as partners in a strong educational affiliation with each other, business and industry, the general public community, joint teaching and research, professional development, shared supervision of internship and practicum, delivery of academic programs, evaluation and outcomes assessment and accreditation.
- C. The Parties acknowledge and understand that any separate corporate existence and organization of the parties shall continue unaltered and unamended by this Agreement.
- D. The Parties shall fully cooperate on all mutually agreed-upon programs, services and activities in accordance with the standards, policies, and practices of licensing and accrediting agencies, provided that the curriculum and courses of study and methods of instruction shall be conveyed in a timely fashion to participating institutions for approval.
- E. This Agreement does not preclude either college from entering into similar agreements with other institutions of higher education.

VI. Compliance with Laws

Each Party agrees that it will comply in all material respects with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, orders and decrees of all governmental authorities in connection with the performance of this Agreement, including without limitation, FERPA and any applicable privacy laws.

VII. Review of the Agreement:

Review of the conditions of the agreement will take place every three years or after curriculum or course revisions have occurred, or as requested by either party through the designated representatives. Revisions must be mutually agreed upon.

VIII. TERM, TERMINATION AND TEACH-OUT

The term of this Agreement shall begin with the Fall 2021 academic term and shall continue until terminated as provided herein.

- A. **Without Cause.** Termination of this agreement will be made within one year of proper notification with the provision that the terms specified herein will continue to apply to graduates who transfer from BHCC to Northeastern within two years of the termination of this agreement.
- B. With Cause. If either Party breaches any material term or condition stated herein or fails to perform or fulfill any material obligation required by this Agreement, the nonbreaching party may terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to the alleged breaching party stating the circumstances of the breach at least seven (7) calendar days before the effective date of termination stated in the notice. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the notice of termination provided by the nonbreaching party may state a period during which the alleged breach may be cured by the breaching party, which cure shall be subject to approval by the nonbreaching party. In the event of a breach the breaching party may be subject to any and all applicable contract rights and remedies available to the University. Applicable statutory or regulatory penalties may also be imposed.

IX. SOLE AGREEMENT, AMENDMENTS, AND GOVERNING LAW

A. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties with respect to the subject matter contained herein, and shall not be deemed to be waived, added to or modified orally; and no waiver, addition, modification, or amendments shall be valid unless in writing, and signed by the authorized representatives of the parties hereto.

The laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts without giving effect to its conflicts of law principles govern all matters arising out of or relating to this Agreement and all of the transactions it contemplates, including, without limitation, its validity, interpretation, construction, performance and enforcement.

The Parties acknowledge that they are agencies of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts or otherwise protected by the laws and regulations thereof. No provision (or lack of provision) herein shall be construed explicitly or implicitly to be a waiver or limitation of sovereign or charitable immunity or rights or defenses arising out or related to such immunity including, but not limited to, a party's rights under the Massachusetts Tort Claims Act.

X. Insurance

The Parties acknowledge and agree that:

BHCC as an entity of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts is self-insured for Worker's Compensation in accordance with Chapter 152 of the Massachusetts General Laws. BHCC, as an entity of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts is responsible for the negligent acts or omissions of its employees acting within the scope of their employment under this Agreement in accordance with the Massachusetts Tort Claims Act.

XI. Assignment

Neither party shall assign or in any way transfer any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party, nor shall a party subcontract any service without the prior written approval of the other party. Any purported assignment of rights or delegation of performance in violation of this Section is VOID.
